

# UNITED STATES

- Scrubs: Nurses, doctors, and other medical personnel usually wear scrubs.
- Identification Badges: Staff must wear visible ID badges with their name and role clearly displayed.
- Footwear: Comfortable, closed-toe, and slip-resistant shoes are required.
- •Infection Control: Uniforms should not be worn outside of the hospital to reduce the risk of infection.
- **Jewelry**: Limited jewelry is allowed, with rings, watches, and bracelets often discouraged in clinical areas due to infection risks.
- Hair and Nails: Hair should be tied back, and nails should be kept short and clean.

# UNITED KINGDOM

**Color-Coded Uniforms**: The National Health Service (NHS) in the UK often uses a color-coded system for uniforms to differentiate between roles (e.g., nurses, doctors, healthcare assistants).

- Bare Below the Elbows: This is a common rule to prevent contamination.
- Footwear: Like in the US, closed-toe, slip-resistant shoes are mandatory for staff working in clinical areas.
- Hair and Nails: Hair should be tied up, and long or artificial nails are prohibited.
- •Infection Control: Uniforms should not be worn outside the hospital.
